## Exemption Application Form Academic Year 2010/2011

***Please read these notes carefully before submitting your application.***

### ***Exemptions: Credit for Prior Achievements***

Students must have sat and passed at appropriate level a recognised examination in a relevant subject area in order to qualify for an exemption on a subject-for-subject basis.

**Exemptions are only granted to persons who are NOT already fully registered students with Accounting Technicians Ireland.**

Persons applying for, and being granted, an exemption in any subject(s) in 1<sup>st</sup> year should note that 2<sup>nd</sup> year subject(s) assume prior knowledge of these 1<sup>st</sup> Year subjects. By accepting an exemption, you are stating that you have this knowledge and are up-to-date with the subject(s) material.

All exemption applications are dealt with on an individual basis. **A student must not assume exemptions – he/she will receive formal notice of any exemptions granted.**

**Please note that if exemptions are granted, a copy of the exemption letter, must accompany your registration form, otherwise the exemption(s) will not be processed.**

### **Important!!**

**Students claiming exemptions should be aware that an award of "Honours" and "Credit Pass" in 1<sup>st</sup> Year CANNOT be obtained.**

**Rules governing the award of Distinction and Credit Pass.**

- **To gain a "Pass with Distinction" in 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> Year, candidates will be required to obtain on their first attempt at four papers a total mark of 250 (i.e. an average of 62.5%) and a mark of not less than 50% in any one paper.**
- **To gain a "Pass with Credit" in 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> Year candidates will be required to obtain on their first attempt at four papers a total mark of 230 (i.e. an average of 57.5%) and a mark of not less than 40% in any one paper other than Financial Accounting and Taxation, where a grade of at least 50% will be required.**

**Finally, please note that, in some cases, other examining bodies will grant exemptions only to persons who have actually sat Accounting Technicians Ireland examinations. They may not grant exemptions/credits in subjects in which the applicant was exempted from the relevant Accounting Technicians Ireland paper.**
